


2023-24 Clyde Count Courier

Another successful Clyde Christmas bird count though many commented on the slow start to the day. Like last year, we had 9 separate parties scouring the countryside. As always, the different teams always seem to complement each other's tallies. This year, the northern section people fared better than the southern areas, though I'm sure it's not related to their birding skills 📀 . This year, we totaled 51 species, with some great sightings (sandhill cranes, trumpeter swans, scaup, merganser, shrikes, red-winged blackbird) and a few notable absent birds (golden eagles, cooper's hawk and pine siskins). Luckily, we got the count in before the snow and cold arrived. Below are the totals going back to the mid 70's. Year 2012 was the highest count at 60 species. You can see a trend of increased species count as we've enlisted some sharp birders, although we're starting to plateau now. We'll see what climate change brings us in the future.
